

# Spring Course May 25-27 & June 8-9





Wood Badge leadership training was originally presented by Lord Baden-Powell for Scouters throughout the world. It completes Scouting's Basic Leadership Training program for all levels of Scouting and consists of two parts.

# Part 1:

### LEARNING & PRACTICAL TRAINING (5 DAYS)

- First 3 days of leadership instruction are held either indoors or outdoors.
- Final 2 days are an outdoor experience.
- Interim Patrol meeting(s) will be held as planned by patrol members.
- Attendance at all 5 days is required to complete the course.

# Part 2:

### APPLYING YOUR NEW SKILLS IN YOUR HOME UNIT AND DISTRICT (12-18 MONTHS)

- After the practical phase, you will fulfill a contract with yourself through your "ticket": Five Scouting goals which you will establish and complete over the next 12-18 months.
- Upon completion, you will be awarded your Wood Badge beads in a special ceremony and become a permanent member of Wood Badge Troop 1.

### Location

The Spring 2024 Wood Badge course will be held at two locations. First weekend @ Camp Lassen \*Butte Meadows CA. Second weekend @ the NorCal Adventure Area \*Dobbins CA.

# Prerequisites

- Be a registered BSA adult leader
- Complete Leader Specific Training for your registered position (including appropriate Introduction to Outdoor Leader Skills, if required for your position) and Youth Protection Training.
- Must be capable of functioning safely in an outdoor environment.
- Provide the Annual Health & Medical Record Parts A, B and C, with C signed and dated on or after June 1, 2023

# Recognition

Upon successful completion of the five days of practical training and completion of the Wood Badge ticket, participants are entitled to receive recognition, consisting of the Wood Badge beads (two wooden beads on a leather thong), a mauve neckerchief, a leather woggle, and a certificate. The recognition items identify a Scouter who has completed advanced leadership training and more importantly, they remind the wearer of their on-going commitment of service to Scouting.



- Registration fee: 60 days or more prior to the start of the course \$200.00. 59 days prior to the start of the course \$225.00. 29 days or until the registration closes \$250.00. All course fees are paid in full at time of registration.
- The course fee covers the cost of training materials, food for session 1, insurance, t-shirt, hat, and course patch. Items to bring are your own personal gear, official Scout uniform and clothing. A detailed packing list will be provided prior to the course.
- Meals for session 2 (lunch day 4 through breakfast day 5), will be prepared by each patrol.
- Each Wood Badge course is limited to 48 participants.
- Wood Badge consists of five days of on-site
- training (session 1 is 3 days, session 2 is 2 days).
- Session 1 begins on Friday. Session 2 begins on Saturday. Each session begins at approximately 7:30 AM and ends at approximately 5 p.m. on Sunday. It is mandatory to attend the course in its entirety, all hours and days, to complete the Wood Badge leadership training.
