At family camp there was time where leaders rose a number of issues – Handed out sheet for efficiency of time.

Other districts have questions as well. No long drawn out, want to move along quickly.

- 1) Lassen is closed, board said to recapitalize the asset. The council has been under headwinds both financially and , council used Lassen to shore up the financials. Small percentage used.
 - Now leasing the new office, sold the old council office. Do not own Cole or Winton, supposedly harder to sell, and make a profit. Norcal is going to be a multi purpose facility; which places Lassen on the chopping board. Lassen Alumni is helping finding a buyer and possibly program. Yes on cub resident camp, on the weekend, Fri-Sun in three separate regions of the state. Locations unknown at this time. Plans for this summer? Yes. Spring, Summer and Fall; how can units plan? Miscommunication at the highest levels? Is there a meeting we can go to provide input? MW says yes; but nothing communicated. Expand the number of cub scouts who can go to camp; 400ish, what does GEC see the attendance be? More affordable, more local? This year will be the "learning year" Covid, LDS and other impacts, trying to bring us the best program. Be patient, in flux. Trying to get locations and dates as soon as possible.
- 2) Lassen Camp is closed, so not able to used. The hope is to be able to use norcal, restroom facilities are not cub level; using chemical toilets, campsites are extremely primitive, gearing up to make it Hoping to invite units to Winton for work weekend Aug 15th-first snow fall, lots of remodel, repair, up in the air for use. Limited use for Camp Hosts: JW goal is to get done, that didn't get done, need to develop a group of people who have keys, meet people, know where to turn on/off things, working on trying to get established this year. Maybe an incentive plan? Looking for volunteers.
- 3) Council fee board to allocate \$40k to Winton and Lassen, allocated to make sure Lassen was able to support the final year. Council has been running on a shoestring budget. Sale of council office has been directed to Winton and Norcal. First time ever, the properties has an operating budget. Going to hire contracts to do the work right, not just band-aid. Camp Winton will have some immediate work done. Tent platforms, septic, and work on rifle range.
- 4) Overhead and contiengy fees Key 3+ are all now board members; MW came up over a decade ago, needs to go to finance committee, MW to go to leadership. 50% goes to Council fees
- 5) Volunteers try to get BSA and OA to help. Parents pay to be there, then stuck at a station. How can we attract or help volunteers? Pushed to District. Other districts have done: Get one paid scout if they volunteer; No guidance, completely lost and volunteers did not have info before the cubs were in front of them.
- 6) Training Only 2 trainings due to low attendance. Need participation and trainers. When dates move it hurts attendance.
- 7) National Awards Program Council person who knows all of the awards, not everyone knows about it, and there is no council person who knows. GS is going to mention at the next advancement committee meeting.
